- Prayer & Encouragement
  - *Letters, E-mails, Text Messages, Holiday & Birthday Cards or Gifts*
- Financial Help:
  - *Books, Supplies, Food, Tuition*
- Dorm Warming Gift
  - *Old or New Furniture, Appliances, Electronics, Blankets*
- Care Packages
  - *Drinks, Snacks, Supplies, Letters*
- Fun Getaways
  - *Top Golf, HayDay, Thunder Game, OKC Dodgers Game, Concerts*
- Gift Cards
  - *Starbucks, Walmart, Target, Chick-fil-a, etc.*
- Home Cooking/Baking
  - *Invite them to your home and eat a meal together.*
  - *Bake them sweet goodies.*

- **How many can be adopted?**

- More than one person can be “adopted” but it would be best if it were one student to adult or family.

- **How long are they adopted?**

- Just for a semester (about 5 months).
- After each semester I will contact everyone and review how things are going. At that time, I will ask both parties and see if they would like to continue.

- **How can I adopt?**

- If you are interested in investing some of your time into these students, there will be paperwork for both parties that will need to be completed. This will benefit the matching process between the student and overseer(s). If there is already a student that the overseer(s) would prefer, there will be a place in the paperwork to make that known.
