

# February 25, 2018 The Call of Moses

**For the Facilitator** - During the week before the meeting, review the story and the questions. Do an internet search on Moses' call and life. Be prepared to summarize his life. Even if you are not telling the story, know it well enough to share. Make sure you are maintaining your own walk with the Lord. Make personal contact with at least one person in your group this week.

# Open in Prayer and Welcome/Introductions

Remind the group of DiscipleGroup Guidelines (Confidentiality, Don't Rescue Don't Fix, No Crosstalk, Use Humor Responsibly, Give Everyone a Chance to Share, Use "I "Statements.)

## **DISCIPLEMAKER QUESTIONS**

- Last week we looked at the Hebrew midwives. What has changed in your life because of what you learned last week? Are there any more thoughts on that story?
- How are your relational investments going?

## Ask a "hook question" to get the group going.

 Share about a time when you heard about or saw something new and thought "I have to get or do that."

## Share background for the story.

Share a summary of Moses' life up to this point or ask the group to tell about his birth, and how he ended up in the desert as a sheepherder.

**Tell the story with your Bible open on your lap – Exodus 3:1-15.** This week's story is about God's call to Moses.

Group members rebuild the story one piece at a time.

Read Exodus 3:1-15 out loud. Were there any important details left out of the telling or retelling of the story?

## Discuss these questions:

- 1. What do you learn about God in this story?
- 2. What do you learn about the characters in the story?
- 3. Share a time you were asked to carry out what appeared to be an impossible assignment. How did you respond?
- 4. Who are the oppressed that you know personally? What does God want you to do about it?
- 5. What would you have done or said had you been Moses? What does following Jesus look like in your life right now?

#### Ask someone to retell the story.

Assign next week's passage. Exodus 12:21-42, the Passover.
